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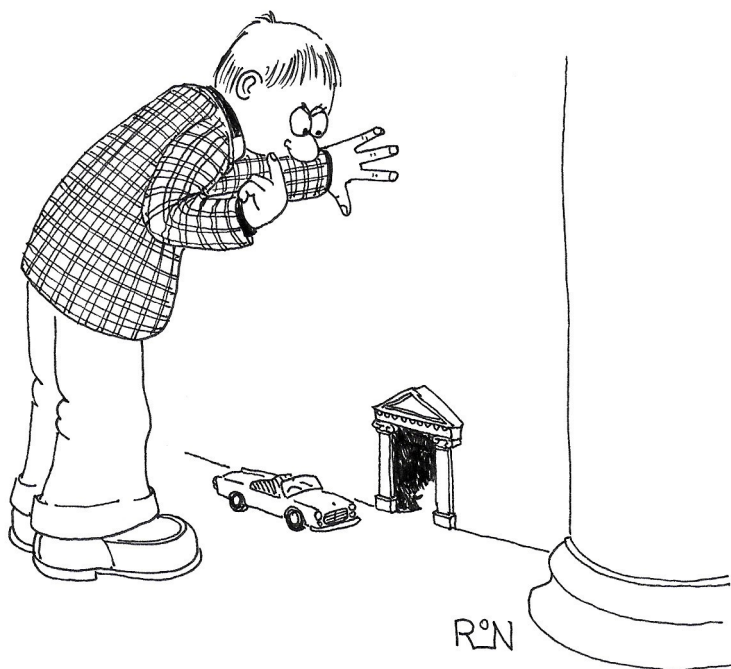

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# 2026 — St. Michael and All Angels 60th Anniversary!

This year's celebrations began with the signing of a new covenant between St. Michael's and Amersham Free Church on Sunday, 18 January, led by the COTHA clergy, Revd. Debbie Oades and Fr. Peter Binns, from St. Michael's, and Revd. Ian Green and Revd. Erna Stevenson from Amersham Free Church. Church leaders, The Revd. Deiniol Heywood, Interim Assistant Archdeacon of Buckingham Episcopal Area; The Revd. George Watt, URC Moderator of The Thames North Synod, and The Revd. Lisa Kerry, Regional Minister of the Central Baptist Association, led the intersessions and joined the COTHA clergy and Roger Leslie, Church Warden for St. Michael's and Beverley Underwood, Church Secretary for Amersham Free Church, for the signing of the covenant. The Revd. Tim Norwood, National Ecumenical Officer for the Church of England, preached the sermon. The choirs from both churches joined forces and accompanied by organist Richard Brazier led the hymns, including *Summoned by God who made us*, by Rachel Hewitt.

Copies of the new covenant will be displayed in both churches once they have been framed.

***What about your parish most warms your heart to think about?***

Its endeavour to be open, both physically and spiritually. Physically the building being open at the heart of the community serves to welcome all at the point of

need. Spiritually, engaging with those of other faith paths and being members of Inclusive Church seeing everyone as Gods loving creation.

***What aspects of the United COTHA services do you most enjoy?***

The opportunity to share in one another's traditions, acknowledging and respecting our differences and seeing all this as opportunities for growth in our walk with Christ. Oh, and the singing is great!!!

***Why did you become a minister?***

Prior to being ordained I had always lived out my faith via music, both by teaching and playing. Through leading a worship band at church I found myself being drawn more and more into the life of the church. Morning prayer and Mass became central to my being. Eventually this draw became so overwhelming that the minister Revd. Rod Cosh put forward the possibility that I was being called to ministry. I spent the next two years fighting against this possibility, I had given up performing because of nerves, being up front wasn't for me. But as we all find out at some point in our lives, we only find true peace when we *let go and let God*. So I became a minister because despite my fears and doubts, God never let go and walked with me down the path he set for me. I pray he always will.

***Do you have a story regarding a spiritual encounter you have had that you would like to share to inspire the readers?***

The Reverend Canon Professor John Rodwell preached at

my ordination to priesthood, he also oversaw our retreat immediately prior. Each Deacon had the opportunity to step aside and spend half an hour with him over this period. My diaconate year had been a difficult experience and for much of this time I had been drawn to Psalm 42. On entering the small room that had been put aside for these sessions, there were several cards, booklets etc. on a coffee table, and Fr. John asked me to pick one at random. On the reverse of it was a text that spoke straight to my heart and was based on Psalm 42! Fr John then spoke with me of things only God and I knew about. Time seemed to stand still in an atmosphere of enfolding love as it seemed we lived together Psalm 42 and then walked into Psalm 43 through which a light shone to the future, one that now, with humility I felt able to step towards.

I have found when you are truly in need and are finally able to lay things before God with truth and humility He meets you where you are with loving compassion in places and through people that surround you in everyday life. Just be you, where you are and make space for God to come alongside. We are all called to be conduits of Gods grace; I truly believe Fr. John was a conduit of Gods grace that day for me, for which I will be eternally thankful.

Only later did I realise Psalm 42-43 is a prayer for healing in preparation for a pilgrimage and what a pilgrimage it is!

#### ***What about your parish most warms your heart to think about?***

I very much appreciate and respect the wonderful energy and faithfulness I've encountered at Amersham Free Church since I came in 2012.

#### ***What aspects of the United COTHA services do you most enjoy?***

Whenever we come to St. Michael's I always enjoy worshipping in your tradition - the St. Michael's clergy are so helpful in 'leading' me through the service at the points where I'm officiating. Whenever we meet at Amersham Free Church it's such a joy to have the church full and be part of such hearty singing.

#### ***Why did you become a minister?***

I felt God was 'nudging' me in that direction and my home church minister in Southampton gave me lots of

encouragement to explore the possibility. As I went through the many interviews that were necessary, doors opened, and so I went to theological college in South London between 1982-1987, became ordained on Trinity Sunday 1987 and have had the joy of serving in five pastorates since.

#### ***Do you have a story regarding a spiritual encounter you have had that you would like to share to inspire the readers?***

I was leading a Retreat and the technology in the Retreat House chapel got the better of me, so we were unable to listen to a hymn (on which the whole session was based) recorded by an esteemed cathedral choir. Quick as a flash, one of the retreatants got up, found the hymn books, distributed them, and sang the hymn herself, with us all joining in the last verse. Her willingness to share the gift of her beautiful voice redeemed the whole session and became one of the highlights of our weekend away. We all felt it was such a precious 'God moment' - one totally unplanned but very much appreciated by us all - and doesn't God work that way so often in our lives?!

Well, if he had long enough, I'd ask him what was his take on 'The Trinity'!

## Going Home by Rebecca Olsen

God knows me. He knows us all. He reads the truth in our hearts. There are moments I forget this though and in those moments I have even felt fear about *going home*. Sometimes when thinking about the words, 'Thy kingdom come' I feel this same resistance. What will His kingdom be like? Do we really need to change what we know? Of course there is bad within this world but there is also so much that is good. But we are loved and love melts away all fear, and we are made worthy to receive the right to enter the kingdom of heaven, on earth or in heaven, through Jesus Christ's death on the cross.

Going home at the end of 2025, to New Zealand where I was born, brought this all to light. After twenty seven years absent, what would I find? How would my family and friends react to seeing me? would they even want to?

I felt the Lord encouraging me as I got ready to depart.

On the airplane tears flowed down my cheeks, the journey suddenly felt real. They were not tears of sadness though, they were tears of relief. I was finally going home and even sharing it with my son, who had asked me to accompany him on the trip.

Once in New Zealand the visits to my huge family began. A 17 year old cousin I had never met contacted me, 'The walk you were going on [and which I was very nervous about] is closed,' she said, 'Can we meet?' We made our way across the North Island towards the west, stopping overnight on the way in an isolated campsite in the heart of the timber trail, with a public toilet about a kilometer away. In the isolation the birds called out confidently and we were treated to a native 'evensong' and a rousing dawn chorus. The next day my beautiful cousin introduced us to her Maori family with whom we shared fish and chips from an open packet on the middle of the kitchen table. After lunch a poi dance was performed for my son, then hugs that evaporated the lost 17 years were given and received. As we drove away my cousin and her friend stood on the doorstep chanting the Haka, a war chant usually chanted at rugby matches nowadays.

Every encounter with friends and family was filled with love that transcended time and space, instant connection and boundless joy, and I quickly realized I had been foolish to fear the trip.

I imagine this love magnified is the love we will receive when we go home to our father, a love within which we have always belonged and from which we have never actually been separated.

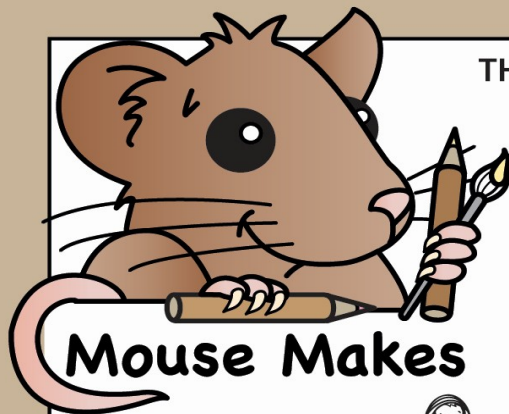

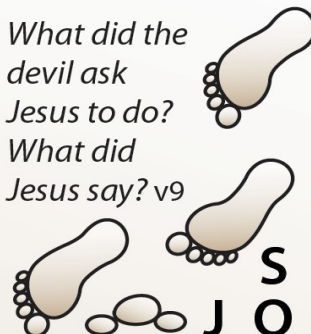
