

AN UNCONDITIONAL WELCOME

- Reflections on the warm embrace of church community BY KATE REED

St. Michael's has, I like to think, a unique sense of community. It's tangible. And it's unconditional. When I walk through the glass doors flanked by Suzanne Rafellini's (niglassartist.com) beautiful angels, it's a small homecoming for me.

As a mother of two still young children, balancing family commitments often means that attending church regularly can be a challenge, especially in the past year when we've been lucky enough to do an extension project.

But whenever I manage to carve out the time to attend the Sunday 10am service - and, even better, sing again robed in the choir - I am overwhelmed by the profound sense of belonging that our church offers.

From the moment I step through the glass doors or the wooden door of the choir vestry, I am met with warm smiles as though it was only last week and not several months since I was last there. I understand a little of how the Prodigal Son must have felt, and in some way, perhaps we all do when we return to worship God.

Since I grew up singing in the choir with my family at St. George's Church in Newbury, I've always gravitated to an Anglican Church to root myself in a new place and make friends. For a time, this was the rather beautiful part-ruined Howden Minster, in East Yorkshire, where I also sang in the choir and where, on a stone bench outside, I spoke to my future husband for the first time, over our lunchtime sandwiches.

When I walked into St. Michael's for the first time in early 2011, having recently moved to Amersham, I was seated behind the late Jane Denny, whom many will remember fondly, and she immediately turned around to welcome me to the church.

I joined the choir led by the incomparable Rachel and Chris, formed a firm

bond with Heather and was able to attend most weeks, slowly getting to know more people. Later, our banns were read at St. Michael's (we married at St. George's and were serenaded

by the choir) and our son Ollie was baptised here by Reverend Diana.

Despite my infrequent attendance in more recent years, I have never once been made to feel like an outsider and I am full of admiration for all the people that make that possible. I've watched in awe as Reverend Debbie's Messy Church Saturday sessions have grown in popularity - and don't think I've ever known a more inclusive church. Every aspect of church life is designed to make everyone feel valued and connected.

It's the warmth and community spirit of our church that always draws me back. It's a place where I feel supported, loved, and part of something greater than myself. For this, I am profoundly grateful.

AMERSHAM DANCE STUDIO By Emma Culmer

Amersham Dance Studio is one of the longestestablished dance schools in Amersham providing high-quality training in Ballet, Tap, Modern, Street Dance and Progressing Ballet Technique. Students attend from the age of 3 and many stay with us until they leave to go to University or Vocational Training. Classes take place after school or on a Saturday in one of our two Amersham locations; St. Michael's Church Hall and Barn Meadow Community Hall.

Classes at ADS are fun and energetic, with a structured approach to ensure progress. We follow the Royal Academy of Dance syllabus for Ballet and ISTD syllabus for Tap & Modern and regularly enter students for examinations. The highlight for all our students is our show which is held at a professional theatre every two years – the next one will be in July 2025.



At ADS we offer a nurturing, supportive and inclusive environment where students can develop their skills and passion for dance, whether they are dancing recreationally or wishing to pursue a career in dance. Dance is not only great exercise it also has so many other benefits, including enhancing creativity and expression; refining motor skills and coordination as well as developing musicality, social skills and self-confidence! FREE MODERN JIVE CLASSES By Rebecca Olsen

Modern Jive is one of the easiest partner dances on the dance scene. Come along on Saturday, 28 September and watch or join in with a free class which will be open to all.

Under the JiveTime brand, Franco and Rebecca have run jive classes and events since way back in the 1990s and were the first to take huge groups of jive dancers away for jive dancing holidays. At the beginning of 2024 they taught free classes on Saturday nights in St. Michael's Church Hall. The classes were a huge success with all those who attended succeeding in picking up the jive moves that were taught each week.

New free classes will run every Friday, from 4 October to 22 November 7.30pm in St. Michael's Church Hall. Voluntary donations are welcome to cover costs. No need to book, just turn up!

ST. MICHAEL'S ORGAN By Stephen Wilcox

St. Michael's has a fine small organ, very well suited to its main function, of leading the congregation in worship. It was originally built by JW Walker in 1895 for a private house in Coleshill, and was bought by the new parish on the Hill in 1945 for what is now the church hall. When the present church was built in 1967, the organ was installed in its current location and slightly enlarged. It speaks directly over the heads of the congregation into the nave – we are lucky that the original idea, of tucking it away in what is now the church office, was rejected!

The organ has two manuals (keyboards), one of which controls pipes tucked in a swell box so that the volume can be controlled by a pedal. It also has a pedal-board to produce the bass notes. There are 12 stops (types of sound) ranging

from a very quiet Dulciana and Salicional to a loud Trumpet, and a number of additional stops which couple the two manuals together or sound the swell manual at a different pitch. These all make it very versatile for solo music as well as services.

If you are a pianist or keyboard player and would like a tour of the organ, or to try it out, please get in touch with the church office. O God, is steadfast, my heart is

Antardhwani and Hindustani Classical Music By Sunil Joshi

India has two classical music traditions, each with its own distinct character yet closely connected: Hindustani (North Indian) and Carnatic (South Indian). These traditions trace their origins back to the sacred Vedic scriptures over 6,000 years ago, where chants evolved into a system of musical notes and rhythmic cycles.

Antardhwani is a non-profit setup that has been offering Hindustani Classical music lessons for the past 3-4 years at St. Michael's Church in Amer-

sham. These weekend classes, available during school terms, cater to all skill levels in Vocals, Tabla, and Bansuri.

Tabla are pair of small drums which provide rhythmic support and embellishment, enhancing the overall musical experience.





Bansuri is an ancient wind instrument, a transverse (side-blown) flute made from a single hollow shaft bamboo.

We also prepare students for graded music exams to track their progress.

and let us know about the work they do. Amersham in Bloom, (with pollinator friendly plants to sell) the local branch of Bucks, Berks and Oxon Wildlife Trust, Sustainable Amersham, Wild Amersham, Little Green Adventures and Repair Café will all be there, together with others. The Repair Café will bring information on what they do, but will not be doing repairs on that day. There will be interactive displays and a chance to ask questions, fun for children, and coffee and tea served with homemade cake — as well as lunch mostly made from locally sourced produce. We hope to organize a Toy Swap and a Book Swap — so watch this space. The Mayor, Councillor Dominic Pinkney, will say a few words. Amersham Town Council representatives will showcase their work in this area, and Buckinghamshire Council will explain the Energy from Waste project. Back by popular request will be Richard Winter, with his videos of local wildlife caught unawares, often lapping up the much needed water he leaves out. Our Hands Together group, who usually concentrate on knitting and sewing lovely items to send overseas to those who need them, became aware of the Loving Earth Project, which encourages exhibitions of art and craft on this theme — so there will be a Loving Earth Exhibition, together with children's art with the title "Something in Nature which I love" All primary School aged children will be very welcome to join in. This year's Harvest Appeal charity is *Carers Bucks* www.carersbucks.org supporting unpaid carers of all ages and backgrounds and in all caring roles. This includes young carers, young adult carers, parents of children with a physical or learning disability, older carers, carers from diverse communities, LGBTQ+ carers and those looking after someone with a mental health condition.



The charity offers a range of information, support and advice covering: carers' rights and entitlements, health and social care issues; creation of an emergency plan; opportunities for meeting other carers via local support groups and in other ways; a regular newsletter; and a listening ear and someone to talk to in confidence. *Carers Bucks* also provides support for unpaid carers and the person they care for while in Stoke Mandeville, Amersham, Wycombe and Wexham Park hospitals.




