## A big year for St. Michael's!

The St. Michael's church building was consecrated in 1966, so next year will be our Diamond Jubilee. And in true St. Michael's fashion, we intend to celebrate this with heart and soul! But we aren't just planning a party: there will be events all through the year.

The first event will be the COTHA service on Sunday 18 January. This falls—very appropriately—at the start of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, and we will be joining to worship at Amersham Free Church. As part of that service, the COTHA Covenant will be renewed, reflecting the close cooperation which exists between our two worshipping communities and acknowledging the fact that St. John's Methodist Church, formerly part of the Covenant, is no longer in Amersham. Our churchwardens and the elders of Amersham Free Church have worked long and hard to revise the document, and we will welcome Revd. Lisa Kenny, Baptist Regional Minister, Revd. Deiniol Heywood, acting Archdeacon of Buckingham, and Revd. George Watt, Moderator of the United Reform Church's Thames North Synod who, along with the clergy, will sign the Covenant.

This will be a very fitting start to our Jubilee Year and we hope as many as possible will be there to celebrate this partnership between our two churches.

## **Holy Innocents**

Turkey, tired tinsel, wrapping paper in every overflowing bin..... The days after Christmas can seem an anticlimax. Yet, on December 28th, on a Sunday this year, the Church hits us hard with Matthew's birth narrative about King Herod's massacre of the Holy Innocents.

As the Coventry Carol sings:

Lully, lullay.....

Herod the King, in his raging,

Charged he hath this day

His men of might, in his own sight,

All young children to slay.

Matthew brings us from a cosy Christmas to the cruel, vindictive revenge response of an autocrat who felt threatened by the reported birth of another King. Control had slipped through his hands with the departure away from him, of the Magi (possibly journeying back to the modern area of Iran) by "a different way".

What might be our response be to this?

Whether we treasure this as "history", in our modern understanding of that term, or as an occasion to reflect on the Incarnation, Matthew has much to offer us.

To his Jewish readers familiar with biblical tradition Matthew says that this little Child is another Moses, destined to lead his people away from an oppressive, occupying force into an eventual political freedom.

To those seeking these days to place the Divine birth into a modern time frame, it perhaps shows, to be sure no threatening little boys escaped, that as much as two years had elapsed between the Birth and Herod's revenge.

Matthew's readers knew from the Book of Exodus that the child Moses and his parents had fled from Egyptian persecution into the desert.

Likewise, Jesus, the ultimate Law Giver, was destined to hide down in Egypt until the danger had passed.

Even today, the Christian Coptic church in Cairo venerate the site there where they believe the Holy Family sheltered while Herod still lived (Not the place here to embark on the fact that Herod died in the year we today call 4 BC!)

Less controversial is the tragic fact that Massacres of Innocents continue today.

Frequently in war zones, families trudge from one unsafe place to another, children, animals, hunger and possessions with them. Often they don't know how long their refugee status will last. Only that there are powers beyond their control. That they might never get "home", till their land, feel settled, instill their language and values into the children, never believe anyone cares.

And how much does this world still need to turn in trust to the Prince of Peace? How are we called upon, as individuals and nations, to ensure that Herod does not have the last word?

What do WE say to Herod?

The 8.30am and 10am services on 28 December 2025 will remember the Holy Innocents.




