



A Service of Lament, Thanksgiving and Restoration

The coronavirus pandemic has resulted in many cases of severe illness and a large number of deaths. People are grieving the loss of loved ones; we are lamenting the pain and anxiety that so many are experiencing; we are also giving thanks for the courage and generous spirit of care that is transforming whole communities; and wanting to gather in prayer to the God who sustains us through trauma and offers hope of restoration and renewal.

This service gives us an opportunity to remember those, who have died and those still suffering; all whose employment and education has been adversely effected and those still shielding. Now that restrictions have been eased, it gives us an opportunity to pray to God for healing, as we look to the future and hope for a return to some form of normality. It also allows us to give thanks for all those both nationally and in our own local communities, who have worked so hard in our hospitals and care homes, and for all who in many different ways, have helped people by shopping, collecting medication or by fundraising, and those, who have been involved in the vaccination programme. We come together to thank God for our deliverance and to look with hope to the future.

Welcome to this service of Lament, Thanksgiving and Restoration, being held in relation to the Covid 19 pandemic. During this service there will be opportunities if you so wish, to participate in naming loved ones who have died and also to offer thanks on our Rainbow wall of 'Remembrance and Thanksgiving'. There will also be opportunity to light candles of hope for Restoration. These resources are there for you, but please do not feel that you have to engage with them if you do not wish, just do or do not, as feels appropriate to you. This service is offered with humility and love, praying that whether you are Christian, a different faith, or of no faith, you may find within what is offered a sense of grace and peace.

Read by a local funeral director representing all funeral directors in supporting the bereaved in such difficult circumstances.
